ISO 3402 was based on the 1991 revision of CORESTA Recommended Method No. 21^[3] and was produced in order to specify a standard atmosphere for conditioning leaf tobacco, and cut tobacco destined for the manufacture of cigarettes and for the manufactured cigarettes themselves.

Fine-cut tobacco is produced and sold at much higher moisture levels than tobacco used for manufacturing cigarettes. Consequently, ISO 3402 is not applicable to fine-cut tobacco or smoking articles made from it.

This document is based on the CORESTA Recommended Method No. 42.^[4]
