- harmonizes and updates the terms and definitions of Non-Destructive Testing (NDT) in ISO/TS 18173:2005, EN 1330-2: 1998 and ASTM E1316-13c.

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This document defines the general technical terms that are used in many non-destructive testing disciplines. These terms are not usually defined in the standards pertaining to individual non-destructive test methods. Thus, the terms and definitions in this document serve to establish a common basis for further standardization and general use in the field of non-destructive testing and thereby provide for enhanced understanding in commerce and industry.
